James Houston was a Captain in Hampton's corps. William Maxwell, under Houston's command, testified that Houston was wounded under Colonel Wade Hampton at the Battle of Kings Mountain.

Houston is not listed among the casualties on the 1909 plaque on the obelisk at Kings Mountain.

Declarant again volunteered his services, though he cannot recollect the date of the service, from the County of Mecklenburg and joined the Company commanded by Captain James Houston and rendezvoused near Charlotte and crossed the Catawba and marched towards King's Mountain. Declarant was one of the advance guard under the command of Captain Thomas Shelby – and joined the corps under the command of Col Campbell [William Campbell] and under him Cols Shelby [Isaac Shelby] and Sevier [John Sevier]. Declarant was in the battle that was fought at that place, and he recollects that his Captain Houston received a wound in the knee, which disabled him. After the battle of King's Mountain declarant returned with his company home, and was discharged.
