



At Quaker Meadows on the return trip after the Battle of Kings Mountain, the officers organized care for the wounded and listed their casualties. The South Carolina men had gone south. Many of Sevier's men went west. Shelby, Cleveland, and Campbell proceeded to Bethabara.

Per Draper, from Colonel John Sevier's corps from the Watauga settlements, John Brown, Michael Mahoney, and William Steele were killed on the battlefield.

Of John Brown, no detailed information survives.

On November 17, 1780, Washington County NC court named John Black administrator for the estate of Michael Mahoney.
