



Private Henry Henigar (aka Henagar) was named by Samuel Newell in his August 1823 letter to David Campbell in Abingdon as killed in action. Henry left no paper trail in Washington County, perhaps an unmarried teenager without recorded property. He was not among the November 1780 Kings Mountain KIAs for whom Washington County ordered estate settlements.

In testimony for federal pension application W4453, Margaret Willhite mentioned Henager in conjunction with Frederick Fisher and Conrad Hice as being in a German community.

Henry Henigar is honored on the 1909 monument at the Kings Mountain battlefield.
