Blackwood, Joseph Old Lincoln County oral history is that Blackwood was mortally wounded at Kings Mountain. Long Creek Presbyterian Cemetery near Bessemer City show death on 22Oct1780, consistent with complications from a wound on 07Oct1780.

Brown, John Draper p303 lists Brown as KIA from Sevier’s men. He is on the 1909 plaque.

Duff, David According to Draper 6DD45, David Duff was killed at BKM. York, Lacey

Giles, William Draper wrote that William Giles was wounded under Capt Jolly at BKM.

Gilmer, William Gilmer was one of the South Fork Boys wounded at BKM.

Hicks, John AA3586 drummer wounded in leg under Col James Williams. Not on plaque.

Miller, Robert Miller was <http://www.revwarapps.org/w5376.pdf> one of Col Edward Lacey’s York District militia men wounded at BKM.

Murphy, Patrick KK White named Murphy as a Sevier’s sharp shooter wounded at BKM.

Smith, Minor Captain Minor Smith of Winston’s Surry County militia was wounded at BKM. <http://www.revwarapps.org/s12895.pdf>

Steele, William William Steele of Sevier’s militia was killed at Kings Mountain per Draper.

Caswell County NC wounded soldier, Joseph Neely did not mention the name.

and were buried within ten miles NW of the battlefield..
