



James Coile is not listed among the casualties at Kings Mountain on the 1909 obelisk plaque. He was wounded by a musket ball which broke his leg and ended his military career.

James Coile was born in Augusta County, VA in 1750. He joined service from the neighborhood of the Waxhaw settlements during the Revolution. Coile was a lieutenant and a captain during actions around Charleston including the fall of Charleston. He returned home about 35 miles above Camden and joined General Sumter as a captain. After the battle of Hanging Rock, Coile's company under Colonel Lacey joined Col Campbell and proceeded to Kings Mountain.

In 1824 in Madison County, GA, Coile applied for a disability pension. In 1832 in Hall County, GA James received a pension for service as lieutenant and captain of \$380 per annum. Pension payments ended at his death on 20Apr1836.
