

John Craig

Congress approved a disability pension (Federal Pension Archives file # S24885) for John Craig due to multiple wounds received in service with the 3rd Maryland Regiment. Among witnesses for Craig was Thomas King, a veteran of the 1st Maryland Regiment. King stated that Craig was wounded at Monmouth and Guilford Courthouse. Major John Davidson who was with the 5th Maryland Regiment which fought at Cowpens said that Craig was wounded at Guilford Courthouse.

John Craig stated that he served under Captain Jacob Brice and Colonel Nathaniel Ramsay who were with the 3rd Maryland Regiment, but not during the 1781 Cowpens and Guilford battles. We have an incomplete record of John Craig's movement among regiments and commanders during the war.

Doctor John T Shaaff examined Craig's **wounds** and stated that they were received at Monmouth, Guilford and **Cowpens**. We presume that he heard this from John Craig.

John Craig himself testified under oath to his service for the war, but not about his wounds.
