In *The Patriots of the Cowpens*, Bobby Gilmer Moss listed soldiers of Delaware and Maryland which he researched in Delaware Archives Except for Henry Zeiller, they were in the Delaware Continental Line under Captain Robert Kirkwood and Colonel John Eager Howard of Maryland's 5<sup>th</sup> Continental Line. Zeiller was in the Maryland Line.

John Cornwall was mortally wounded and left to die on the field.

John Harriss was wounded. He recovered and rejoined the soldiers.

John Hatfield was wounded in the belly and left on the field.

William Higgins (Haigans) was killed in action.

Levin Lycatt was wounded in the thigh and disabled.

John Mitchel was wounded in the arm and leg and left at the battlefield.

Andrew Pollard was wounded in the arm and stayed with his company though unfit to serve.

James Scott was wounded in the leg and left on the battlefield.

John Todd was wounded in the neck and arm. He rejoined the company, but unfit to serve.

Richard Treasurer last a leg in the battle and was left on the field.

South Carolina later granted Richard  $\pm 10$  to enable him to return home. Henry Zeiller was killed in action.
