

William Durham

Ann Durham (FPA W4186) applied for a widow's pension 28Nov1842 in Baltimore. She claimed that she was married to **William Durham** in Joppa Town, Harford County MD by Rev William Wilmer. Ann stated that William served in the 6th Maryland Continental Line under Captain Andrew Hines at the battles of Camden and **Cowpens**.

John Durham, nephew of William Durham, testified that William Durham married Ann Tolby and raised a family.

Elizabeth Durham Cooper, first daughter of William and Ann, testified that William was in a number of battles in the south, one being the Battle at the Cowpens. She also stated that her father had **scars from two battle wounds**, one on the head and another on his hand.

Two witnesses from Venango County PA deposed that William Durham wandered away in a deranged state in the 1820s and died in that county about twenty years ago.

Maryland state rosters showed that Private Will Durham joined the **6th Maryland Regiment** on 28Apr1778 on a 3 year enlistment. He was present at a muster 01Nov1780.
