

## Aquilla Hollingsworth

Adam Skains applied for a pension (FPA s11404) in Butler County AL in Feb1833. As part of his testimony, he said that he was “turned over to Captain Hollingsworth” and served some time under him. Captain H. was killed and **died of his wounds** at Tarleton's defeat. He commanded by Colonel Thomas Brandon.

**Aquilla Hollingsworth** was born to Elias and Dinah Hollingsworth about 1754 at Mill Creek Hundred, in New Castle County, DL. He died from wounds received 17Jan1781 at the Battle at the Cowpens. His siblings listed residence in Union District, SC.
