

David McKinney's widow said "*She thinks he the said **David McKinney** served part of said time in South Carolina and that he was **wounded in the battle** at a place called "**the Cowpens**" or "Cow-plains".*" She also said "from Augusta County" and "served under Captain McKittrick."

A number of soldiers testified of their service under Captain John McKittrick of Augusta County VA. John himself testified that he served as sergeant in Captain Tate's Company of Major Triplett's Rockingham Rifles while in South Carolina. .It is certain that a number of Augusta County patriots joined with Daniel Morgan at the Cowpens.

Margaret Wallace married David McKinney 25Sep1785 in Augusta County VA. David died 07May1822 in Orange County IN.

On 25May1851, Margaret McKinney applied for a widow's pension in Washington County, IN. In her deposition she was uncertain about military service details, but believed the facts in the first paragraph above.

On 16Jun1851 in Fulton County Illinois, James McPheeters, 75, gave testimony that he was a cousin of David McKinney; knew him for the space of 40 years before his death; that his death occurred in Washington County Indiana; that his cousin intermarried with Margaret Wallace which marriage took place in the deponent's father's house in Augusta County Virginia; that he has reason to believe that his cousin served under Captain McKittrick.
