

Andrew Miller

William Buchanan testified in his pension application (FPA S21675) in 1832 at Abbeville District SC: “For four months at least I served as a private under **Captain Andrew Miller** & Lieutenant Joseph Wardlaw, the former of whom was **killed**, and the latter of whom was wounded at the battle of the **Cowpens**. After Captain Andrew Miller's death I joined a company commanded by Captain Moses Little or Liddell”

Several soldiers (e.g. John Lindsay and John Miller) mentioned Andrew Miller as their captain or the change of command after his death. Captain Andrew Miller's son, John Miller, and nephew, George Miller, were soldiers in the Abbeville Whig militia. Andrew's brother, John Miller, took his place as captain of Abbeville militia.

Andrew Miller lived on Clarks (now called Chickasaw Camp) Creek in Abbeville district adjacent to Samuel Lindsay and John Lindsay.

In Abbeville, by 06Oct1802 Elizabeth Miller, widow of Andrew Miller, assigned executors to settle Andrew's estate.
