



Charles Holland was born 02Apr1758 in Maryland. Charles married Sarah Hughes abt. 1789 in Abbeville District SC. Sarah died in 1804. Charles remarried to Elizabeth Smith. He died 16Mar1846 in Clarkson, Choctaw County MS and was buried at New Hope Presbyterian Church Cemetery in Webster Co MS.

On 13Oct1832, Charles Holland appeared in open court at Tuscaloosa AL to apply (FPA S7017) for a pension.

Charles Holland enlisted Sep1776 under Captain James McCall in Ninety Six (Abbeville) District SC, in Andrew Williamson's regiment of militia. He was assigned to Andrew Pickens' company. There were several reassignments, changes of command, and maneuvers before 1781. In Jan1781, Holland returned to South Carolina from retreating into North Carolina under Captain McCall. Then under General Daniel Morgan, they defeated Banastre Tarleton at Cowpens on 17Jan1781. In the battle at the **Cowpens**, Charles Holland was **wounded by a bayonet** thrust through the body. He recovered in two or three weeks to participate in other battles and receive other wounds.

Children of Charles Holland were Margaret, Absalom, Charles, Jacob, Sarah, and Reuben.
