

**William Scally** appeared before Judge John McNairy in Nashville TN on 02Jul1818 to apply for a hardship pension based upon his service during the Revolutionary War. He applied for extension of the pension at age 77 in 1820.

In 1776, Scally served a year under Captain William Fountain in the 1<sup>st</sup> Virginia Regiment. Then he served three years in the 4<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment under Captain William Grogan. Under Colonel William Washington's light horse, William Scally was in the Battle at the **Cowpens** on 17Jan1781 where he was **wounded**. Scally was treated and later in action at Guilford Court House and Eutaw Springs.

Major William Grogan submitted a certification of Scally's service.

William Scally died 02Jul1823 in Nashville.
