

William Warren on 19Nov1832 in Christian County KY applied for a federal pension (FPA s1838) based upon his service as a soldier during the Revolutionary War. Because of loss of mobility from his war wound, the magistrate took his deposition at his residence.

He was born in Orange County VA about 1762. William enlisted in Rockingham County under Captain Wallace with messmate Corporal Hammonds. He was sworn in at Mr. Harrison's (the Daniel Harrison house in present day Harrisonburg was known as Fort Harrison during the war) house. They marched to Hillsborough and joined General Gates' army. They marched to Charlotte and General Greene took command. His company was assigned to General Daniel Morgan's army and was in the Battle at the **Cowpens**. was **shot in the thigh** and left upon the field. He was afterwards taken to the house of Kit Hicks by Mrs. Hicks and daughters where he was nursed and cured. The Army retreated to Virginia with prisoners taken at the Battle of the Cowpens and upon the return of same he joined his old company at Santee and learned that his Captain Wallace was dead having lost his life at the battle of Guilford.

After the war, Warren moved to Pendleton District SC where he married Rebecca Cannon.
