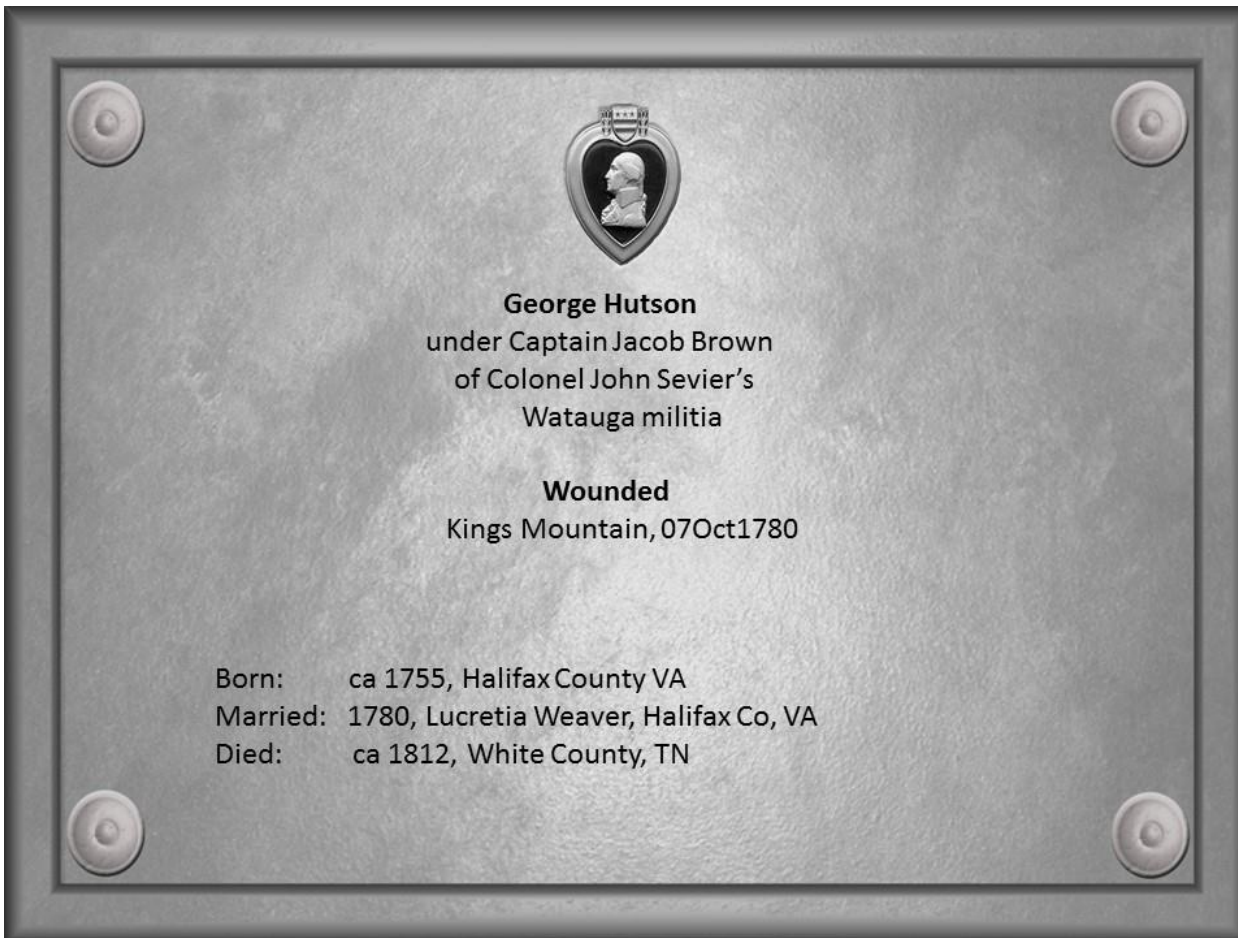


Hutson, George

George William Hutson was the son of Albert Lee “Abel” Hutson in Halifax County VA in the 1750s. He married Lucretia Weaver in Halifax County about 1780. George died in White County TN about 1812. Lucretia lived on in White County until 1865 to age 101

The third George and Lucretia child was born in 1783 in South Carolina. Their twin 4th and 5th were born in White County TN in 1785. There are Hutson cemeteries in White County, but no markers for George or Lucretia are listed.

Lucretia’s brother, Samuel Weaver, married George’s sister, Nancy Hutson. Note that younger siblings of George and Nancy spelled their surname Hudson instead of Hutson.



09Oct1782, Samuel Weaver testified at Quarterly Sessions Court of White County TN to apply for a pension (\$3516). In details of his service, one deployment was the 07Oct1780 Battle of Kings Mountain under Jacob Brown in John Sevier’s regiment from Washington County NC (now TN). Weaver stated that he was detained a long time attending his brother in law, George Hutson who was wounded in the battle. George finally recovered and they came home We can surmise that George Hutson was one of the patriots treated by Dr. Joseph Dobson around Greenlee’s Ford (Morganton NC) of the Catawba.

George Hutson signed the Watauga Petition of 05Jul1776 at Womack’s Fort. Samuel Weaver was listed in Captain Jacob Womack’s company of Fincastle County militia in 1777.
