

William Fowler

Lewis Preston Summers in *Annals of Southwest Virginia* listed the Washington County militia. Summers shows **William Fowler**, Ensign killed died in service, **Kings Mountain**.

On 15Apr1783, Washington County Court in session voted to extend county support to William Moor, Frederick Fisher, Bennoni Benning, and John Skeggs wounded at BKM. Thomas Hobbs and John Cusick were also granted county pension extensions for wounds in other battles. The **heirs of William Fowler** had county support extended.

In his 1823 letter to Virginia Governor David Campbell, Samuel Newell listed Kings Mountain casualties and did not mention William Fowler. Newell, however, said that his list was incomplete because he could not recall them all.

The 1909 obelisk plaque at Kings Mountain does not list Fowler among the casualties.

On 07Feb1775 Robert Crow was certified by Fincastle County court to be administrator of the estate of William Fowler, deceased.

On 27Sep1785 in Montgomery County VA court, Robert Crow appealed for county support for the Fowler orphans. He had received only £36.0.0 since 1775 or 76.

We must conclude that Summers entry on page 1390 of *Annals of Southwest Virginia* is erroneous in stating Kings Mountain.
