

Odell McGuire wrote a very readable and instructive article posted at <http://rockbridgeadvocate.com/odell/cowpens.htm> about the Rockbridge Rifles at the Cowpens.

It states that **Trimble Moore was killed** in the **Battle at Cowpens** in the company of Captain James Gilmore's Rockbridge Rifles. A letter from Ensign John McCorkle names Trimble Moore as his neighbor (around Beverly Manor near the Augusta/Rockbridge County Virginia line). The pay roll roster for Gilmore's company lists Trimble Moore with the men.

The young soldier left no documentary tracks. His neighborhood had several Trimble and several Moore residents. <http://www.rootsweb.ancestry.com/~vaugust/b&bmap.html> has a map annotated with family and congregation locations in this upper Shenandoah Valley area. Plaque below is at Old Providence Presbyterian. Soldiers killed in battle were most often buried at or near the battlefield.
