Andrew Evans met Samuel Newell in the expedition to the battle of Kings Mountain. They served again in the Boyds Creek campaign. Evans was in the 1786 caravan to Boyds Creek. He built a ferry on the French Broad River at Buckingham Island where the warriors path crosses the river. After he moved to Pittman Creek in Kentucky about 1798, Evans sold the ferry to John Brabson (deed recorded in Watne County KY). In 1794, Evans was an officer of the Knox County Court.

When Pulaski Couty was formed from Lincoln Couty, Evans was Tax Commissioner and Newell (who also moved) was first sheriff.

Andrew moved to Gosport, Owen County Illinois with some of his children who had married Samuel Newell children. Samuel Newell also bought tracts from the Terra Houte land office and moved with his son William Tell Newell to Gosport.
