

Dr. William McLean placed the first monument at Kings Mountain for four South Fork Boys who were killed in the battle, Major William Chronicle, Captain John Mattocks, William Rabb, and John Boyd. Erected in 1814, it is the second oldest revolutionary battlefield monument after Lexington Green. Eroded by wear of weather, the monument became hardly readable, so a second durable inscribed stone was placed beside it

McLean was a young corpsman among his South Fork Boy neighbors. He was half brother of Major Wm Chronicle. Though not in the battle, William treated Moses Henry, who was wounded at Kings Mountain, for nine months until Henry succumbed to his injury.
