

Burke and Rutherford men under McDowell

**Robert Carson** was born near Ingles Ferry, out of bounds per King George Proclamation of 1763. He was a foot soldier in Andrew Colville's company of Washington County militia who remained at Cowpens 07Oct1780. He rejoined the horsemen on the day after the battle. Robert's pension declaration was recorded by Warren County TN clerk, Joseph Colville. <https://revwarapps.org/s3207.pdf>

**Thomas Lytle** was a foot soldier in Burke County militia who arrived at Kings Mountain on the day after the battle.

**Danza Metcalf** was in the retreat to Nolichucky and return to Kings Mountain among other deployments.

**Warner Metcalf** of Rutherford County NC served with his brother Lanza.

**William Morrison** testified in Dickson TN that he was in Capt John McDaniel's company of Burke County militia at Kings Mountain. Details in his declaration are somewhat distorted such as many were five decades after the action. <https://revwarapps.org/w1455.pdf> William Jewell of Nashville, also a BKM vet, verified Morrison's service.

The widow of **James Murphy** applied for a pension in Burke Co court in 1857.
